Another summer has passed for member of Warilla Surf Lifesaving Club and now we are having a short break before the start of next season. The 2005/06 season has been another successful one for our club with our members having spent over 4000 voluntary hours patrolling Warilla beach. It is our aim to provide a safe beach for the general public and in this area our patrolling members have excelled in their vigilance and service. We can report no fatalities at Warilla beach.

My thanks to club captain to Peter Condran, Wynn Morris our rescue services co-ordinator and all the patrol captains who managed to obtain a high standard of participation from their respective patrols over 70% of our members have received 100% patrol attendance. It is also pleasing to see our membership numbers have increased in both senior and junior activities.

One aspect that contributed to our achievements was the award training led by Jim fields, with assistance from Michael Beveridge and Hayley Mansbridge and Chris Perretta. This team put through 34 candidates who were successful in gaining their surf lifesaving awards.

It was great to see our members assist in projects organised by our club without membership participating these projects would not be completed.

The club would also like to thank Jim Bradley (disabled surfers) for the donation of a aquatic wheelchair to be permanently located at Warilla beach.

In Competition our club had another outstanding season, this can be attributed to our coaches and those who assisted in training, also to our members who are dedicated in training and strive to reach the high level of competition in Branch, State and Australian championships.

1. Our IRB teams were successful in picking up medals at the State and Australian Championships
2. At the NSW Endurance Championships Warilla Barrack Point Surf Lifesaving Club finished 2nd overall
3. Again Warilla successfully staged the MGB tax accountants iron man event which was well supported by other clubs and branches.
4. At the NSW Interbranch Championships David and Scott Smith along with Andrew Varga were selected in the NSW State team, also Jordan White was drafted into the Northern Territory Team
5. At the NSW Country Championships held at Woolgoolga, our club finished 3rd in the juniors and 2nd in the seniors which gave us 2nd overall.
6. In the Sydney Water Surf Series held over 4 rounds we finished 1st
7. At the NSW Surf Premiership held over 4 rounds our club finished 4th overall and 1st in the country point score
8. At the South Coast Branch Championships our club finished 1st in the seniors and 2nd in the juniors
9. At the NSW Senior and Age State Championships, Warilla Club finished 1st in both country pointscores
10. At the NSW State Age Championships Warilla walked away with 13 medals
11. At the NSW Open State Championships Warilla finished with 18 medals
12. At the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships Warilla finished with 7 medals
13. Warilla Bowls Boat Series again was a great success with over 70 crews from Illawarra, South Coast and far South Coast
14. At our club presentation night 15 years at 100% patrol service award was awarded to Tony White, Garry Trotter and Alan Beveridge

I heartily congratulate all of the above successful candidates for putting in the time, effort and discipline needed to acquire each award. Well done girls and guys.

A lot of credit for this satisfying result is on account of the valuable contribution given by Mick Beveridge, Hayley Mansbridge, Chris Perretta, Nathan Perretta and Paul Creighton in helping these candidates gain their awards. This assistance is very much appreciated by me and the Warilla Barrack Point Surf Club.

I have held the position of Educational Co-ordinator with the surf club for 6 seasons and I believe it is time for me to move on and hand the position onto younger members. During my years in this role I was privileged to witness 110 candidates gain their Bronze Medallion, 45 their Surf Rescue Certificate and 24 gained their Advanced Resuscitation Certificate. I am pleased that Michael and Hayley are prepared to take on the duties of educational co-ordinator for the surf club. With the assistance of the Perretta boys the surf club training will be in very good hands. This will allow me to move on to assist the branch with assessments or maybe some other functions within the surf club. I will still be actively involved with the surf club and will be willing to assist with training if required. I would advise Michael and Hayley to commence Surf Rescue and Bronze Medallion training mid September after advertising in the Lake Times in conjunction with the Junior Registration advertising and to follow this up with an Advanced Resuscitation Certificate class around the new year. It is going to be very difficult year for training with S.L.S. bringing in the new "rescue breathing" resuscitation changes.

In conclusion may I wish all surf club officers, patrol members and the clubs junior and senior competitors an incident free and successful 2006 – 2007 season.

In accordance with our governing requirements, I present the Financial Statements and Audit 2005-2006 for the Warilla Barrack Point SLSC.

The figures show just how hard it is to maintain the current expectations of our Members.

Last season we spent \$9349 on Carnival entries. This season we have spent \$16644. There has not been a corresponding increase in Members attracting funds or going out and earning income. It seems that at all levels of Competition, be it Australian, State or Branch., the easy answer is just to increase carnival entry fees. It is the Clubs that are hardest hit by these increases. Unfortunately, our Club will not be able to sustain many more increase like we have endured. The monthly financial figures show that our expenditure is becoming greater than our income.

The time cannot be too far away when we must charge our members a realistic figure to compete .

I would like to thank Alan Beveridge, Graeme Morrison, and the rest of the management committee for their assistance this season.

I congratulate all those who help maintain our Club's record of successfully patrolling our beach.

1. Statement of Accounting Policies.

These financial statements are a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporated Act (NSW). The committee have determined that the Club is not a reporting entity as defined in Statement of Accounting concepts 1; definition of the Reporting Entity, and therefore there is no requirement to apply accounting concepts or standards in the preparation and presentation of these statements.

The statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporated Act (NSW). , and the following accounting standards:

AAS 5 Materiality

AAS 8 Events Occurring after reporting date

No other statements of accounting concepts or accounting standards have been applied.

The financial statements are prepared on an accrual basis from the records of the Club. They are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current values of non-current assets.

Accounting policies have been consistently applied with those of the previous years unless otherwise stated.

Property, Plant and Equipment.

Property, plant and equipment are included at cost. All assets excluding freehold land and buildings are depreciated over their useful lives.

The carrying amounts of all non-current assets are reviewed to determine whether they are in excess of their recoverable amount at balance date. If the carrying amount of a non-current asset exceeds the recoverable amount, the asset is written down to the lower amount. In assessing recoverable amounts the relevant cash flows have not been discounted to their present value.

Income Tax.

The club is regarded as a registered surf life saving club and as such is exempt from Income Tax.
